At only 6 ½ lbs, she is cuddly now, but will probably grow up to be good-sized. All of the pups are up to date on shots, spayed/neutered and micro-chipped. Look for the CCHS unit of adoptable pets, volunteers and friends of CCHS in the Trentonfest Parade Saturday, Sept, 7.



REMINDER

Just a few years ago heartworm was not a common problem in this area. Now, however, we see more and more cases all of the time. Treatment takes many weeks, is expensive and is difficult for your pet. Please protect your pet with monthly preventative and continue the treatment throughout the year.

TRAINING TIP

Generally folks tend to focus on correction of bad behaviors when they train pets. It is beneficial to your pet to also praise his good behaviors so he knows what we want him to do. Praise your “good dog” when he simply chews his toy and not your favorite flip flops. If he wanders into the neighbor’s yard but comes when you call, give him lots of love for coming back. Even if he is just sitting politely at your feet, give him a pat on the head for his calm behavior. You and your pet will both benefit.

CCHS BUILDING

Stop by the CCHS facility at 1301 Apple Lane in Breese to check out the merchandise, including pet collars, leashes, toys and much more, as well as CCHS logo apparel for people from onesies to 3X.

The store is open from 10 a.m. until 2 p.m. every day and 5:30-7:30 p.m. Mon through Friday. The store will be closed Saturday and Sunday evenings, except by appointment. The phone number is 526-4500.

Proceeds from the store go toward helping CCHS pets.

Regulations prevent the CCHS from accepting strays or drop offs. If you want to surrender your own pet, please call for information on the proper procedure. It is illegal to dump animals.

Meet and Greets are held the first and third Saturdays each month. The next Meet and Greet will be Saturday, Sept 7, at Breese North Side Park from 10 a.m. until noon. Micro-chipping for your pet will be available for \$25, including registration.

The next regular CCHS meeting will be held Wednesday, Sept 11, at 7 p.m. at the CCHS facility at 1301 Apple Lane. Meetings are open to the public and new members are always welcome.

If your health, finances or housing make it necessary for you to surrender your pet, CCHS may be able to help.

Call the CCHS at 526-4500 to start the process.

You must provide your pet's medical history from your vet, a photo and a completed surrender application with information about your pet's

personality and training, and your pet will be tested for adoptability.

If all goes well, he will be added to the CCHS roster, and the search for his new family will begin.

There is no charge for surrendering your pet.
