Community Link will hide hundreds of home-made dog treats for guests to sniff out.

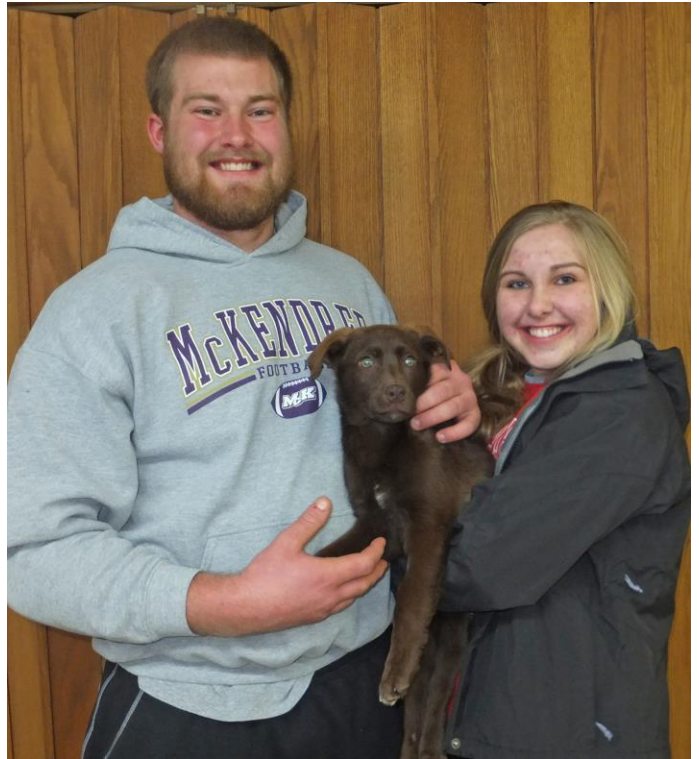
Folks may get acquainted with CCHS adoptable dogs during the event.

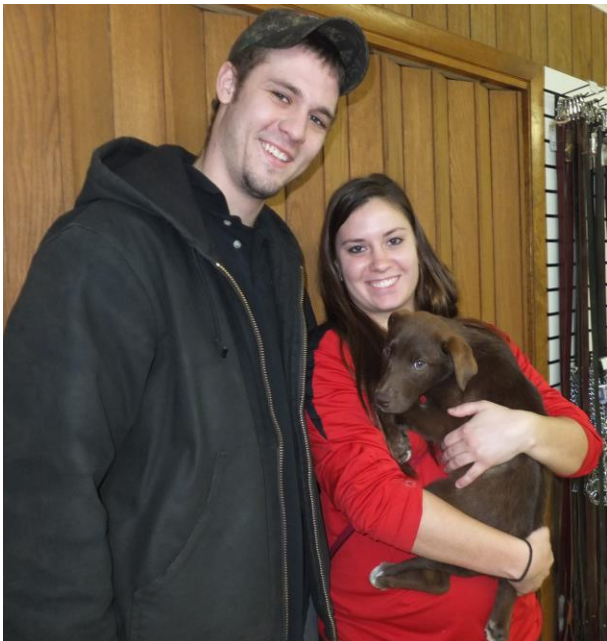

PET TAG/ MICRO-CHIP MAY BRING YOUR LOST PET HOME QUICKLY

An ID tag is one way to improve the chances of your getting your pet back if he gets lost.

If your pet wanders off and is wearing a tag with his name and your phone number, all it will take to get him home is a phone call.

His collar and tags could be lost, so an even better way to get him home is to micro-chip him.

This tiny implant carries a number to identify your pet so the company where the chip is registered will contact you if your pet turns up at a vet, shelter or the police.

APRIL SPECIAL—ANXIETY WRAPS 20% OFF

Just in time for the storm season Anxiety Wraps will be marked down 20% for the April Special.

For nervous dogs, Anxiety Wraps are snug vests that feels like a comforting hug during storms, fireworks or other situations that cause your pet to be anxious.

As the weather warms CCHS short-sleeved tees are only \$10, so you can stock up.

For dogs we carry treats, leashes, collars, beds, toys, anxiety wraps and bowls, as well as treats, collars and toys for cats.

Pet ID tags engraved on one side can be purchased for \$6 or on both sides for \$7.

For people we have caps, tees and hoodies.

The CCHS cookbook Wags, Whiskers & Wecipes costs only \$12! The cookbook contains recipes for appetizers, soups, veggies, entrees, breads, desserts, as well as treats for dogs and cats, and more!

Pet calendars are still available for \$10.

The store at 1301 Apple Lane is open Sunday through Friday 10 a.m. until 2 p.m., Saturday 9 a.m. until noon, and Monday through Friday 5:30-7:30 p.m.

Spay and neuter your pets to cut down on unwanted litters this spring! No littering!

The mosquitoes have arrived, so make sure your pet is on heartworm preventative. Heartworm has become very prevalent in our area, and it only takes one bite to infect your pet. Don't take a chance!
